Claire M. Anderson

Originally from Southern California, with a background in education and history, Claire currently serves St. Robert Catholic Church as Pastoral Associate. She holds a Master of Divinity degree from St. Francis Seminary (Milwaukee) and is currently working toward a Doctorate in Ministry at the Catholic Theological Union.
